Welcome to another Mt Gravatt Show. Our first Mt Gravatt Show was held in 1915 in the area known as James' paddock between the Mt Gravatt Hotel and the Mt Gravatt State School. It relocated to this present site in 1918.

In those 108 years much has changed. Once there were more than 30 shows in greater Brisbane. Now only four remain. The Mt Gravatt Show continues to thrive, thanks to the hard work of many members, volunteers, show stewards, Judges, staff and sponsors.

In many ways the Mt Gravatt Show is the mini "ekka" for families at affordable prices. But more than that, it is the show aimed at highlighting the talents and interests of our local community with dancing and school band performances, arts and crafts, photography, community and student art, cooking competitions, quilting, bees and honey displays, woodwork demonstrations, truck and ute show, an Air Sea and Rescue vehicle display and the Mt Gravatt Men's Shed display.

This year we have added some new attractions as well as old favourites. Sheep Dog trials are back, children's pony rides, a petting animal nursery and sheep shearing display, Dreamtime Reptile show, a Scarecrow competition, LEGO, Organic Growing Display, an Invicta Sword Fencing display, and of course amusement rides. This year's night program will include a new night-time laser show, a whip cracking and flame show, the exciting Flux gymnastic flame show, as well as our FMX Freestyle Bikes and fireworks.

In keeping with tradition, going back 108 years, we maintain our agricultural heritage with a full program of horse equestrian events, cattle and sheep judging.

We are grateful for the continuing support of the Mt Gravatt Showgrounds Trust, our local elected representatives, Mr Ross Vasta MHR, Ms Corinne McMillan MP and Deputy Mayor Cllr Krista Adams.

If the show is to continue and grow, then we need more local community members to become involved. So please consider joining the Mt Gravatt Show Society and volunteering.

The Queensland Off-The-Track Program (QOTT Program) has been established to support a high-quality first transition for Standardbred and Thoroughbred horses, bred for the racing industry and domiciled in Queensland at the time of their retirement from racing or breeding activities.

To maximise aftercare outcomes for Standardbreds and Thoroughbreds, the QOTT Program will support the placement of retired racehorses into second careers, promote life after racing options and identify retirement pathways. Queensland Off-The-Track will stimulate demand for the breeds and increase awareness of their adaptability and versatility of use; provide education and support for racing industry participants and the domestic horse community to optimise racehorse aftercare; and advocate for the lifelong traceability of retired racehorses beyond their first exit from the racing industry.
