CONDITIONS OF ENTRY

1. All exhibitors should refer to the General Competition Regulations as provided by the Queensland Chamber of Agricultural Society's Inc and applicable Society/Association.
2. All exhibits must be the bona fide work of the exhibitor.
3. Class definitions must be strictly adhered to.
4. Prints may be commercially processed.
5. The Mt Gravatt Show is a public (and therefore a family) event. No nude/pseudo-nude or provocative images will not be accepted.
6. There is no limit to the number of entries in each section.
7. Prints in all sections must be suitably mounted on stiff cardboard (5mm thick) or mounted on matboard (No framed entries will be accepted)
8. When using stiff cardboard, attach covered hooked Velcro dots to the back the of the mount in each corner and in the centre to hold your entry securely to the carpeted display board.
9. Please make sure your photos are securely mounted or glued onto stiff card.
10. Class 1-6 Prints must be a minimum size 20 cm x 25 cm (8" x 10") without mount
11. Size 50 cm x 40 cm (20" x 16), (including Mount).
12. Entries in Students sections Class 7 ,8 & 9 must be a minimum size 8 x 10 inch (20 cm x 25 cm) including mount or Cardboard border.
13. All photos must be Labelled on the back with the name and address of the entrant, Title, Class, Image number of entry to agree with entry form, and an arrow indicating the right way up. One entry form per person.
14. All prints are to be delivered in a suitable folder / envelope / bag with name on the outside for identification, which can be reused for repacking. Please ensure prints will not fall out.
15. No Exhibit is eligible to compete if it has won a prize at any previous Mt Gravatt Shows.
16. Prize winning prints and others specially nominated by the judge will be displayed. Remaining accepted prints shown at the discretion of the Stewards as display space permits.
17. Permission is assumed to reproduce any entry for publicity purposes.
18. No late entries or exhibits will be accepted.
19. Entries that have return postage and packing included will be posted during the week after the show.
20. All care will be taken, but no liability will be accepted by any officer, or the society, in the unlikely event of loss or damage to exhibits Neither the Show Society nor the Stewards are responsible for loss or damage of entries.
21. The judge's decision will be final, except that the Committee reserves the right to consider a protest lodged in accordance with the Society'

All Competitors enter these events at their own risk. Neither the Organising Committee, Mt Gravatt Show Society, Mt Gravatt Showgrounds nor the owners of the property accept liability for any accident, damage, injury or illness to owners, grounds, spectators or any person or property whatsoever.

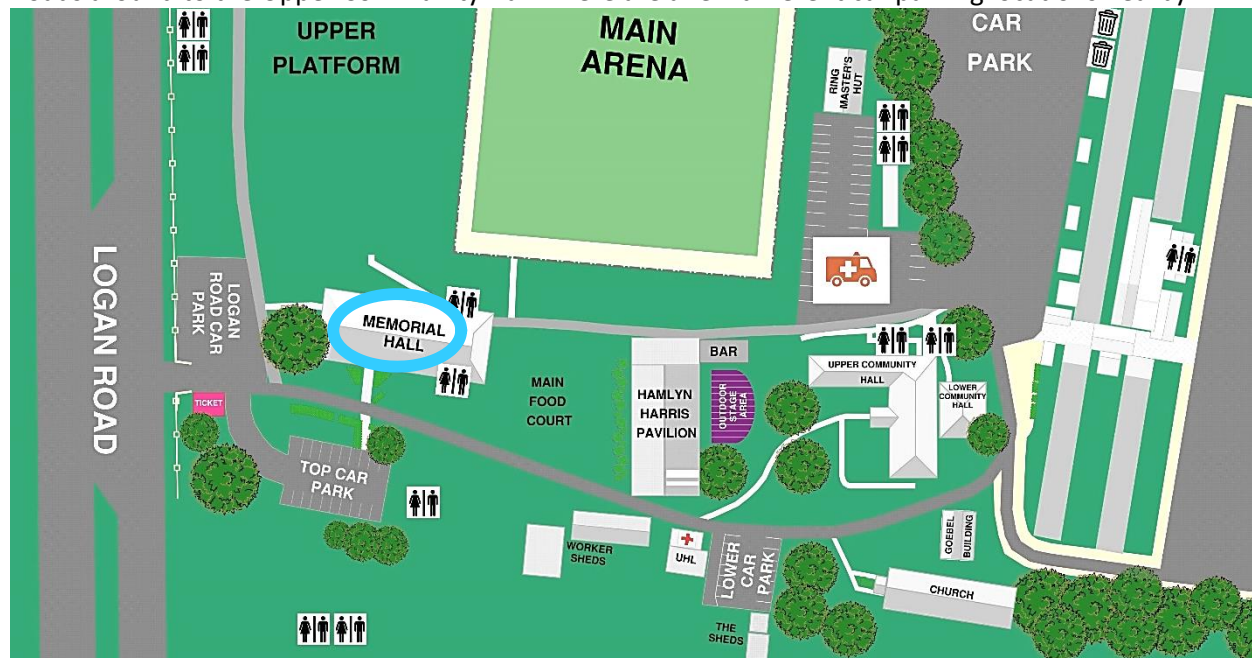

FAQ

Q: How do I enter?

A: You can download the form from the website and submit it with your entries.

Q: I can't drop my entries off on the specified delivery dates, can I drop them off earlier?

A: Yes, you can by contacting the Show Office to arrange a suitable time. Please ensure that you have attached the Exhibitors Label (title of the artwork, class category of your entry, your name, contact number, email address (on the back of the article) along with the completed entry form when delivering the artwork.

Q: What if I can't collect my article/s on the Sunday 27th 3:30pm- 4:30pm?

A: Anything not collected during that time can be collected from the Show Society Office during their Show Office hours in the following week after the Show.

Q: What if I can't collect my article in person?

A: If someone is collecting your artwork/s on behalf of you please ensure they can provide proof of the Entry Receipt on collection. Failure to do so will result in them not being allowed to take the with them.

Q: Will I get charged to come into the Show to collect my article?

A: If you enter the Showgrounds before 3pm you will be charged an entry fee, however if you enter after 3pm your entry will be free.

SUBJECT DEFINITIONS

Monochrome Prints – An image that gives the impression of no colour. ie: contains only shades of grey which can include pure black, pure white, or gives the impression of being a greyish image that has been toned in one colour across the entire image. (ie: Sepia, Red, Gold, etc).

Colour Prints – A print of any subject that is not a monochrome print.

Creative – A pre-station of a subject in a pictorial and pleasing way that it is not normally observed by the human eye. This can include, but is not limited to in camera movement, zoom and composite images, or computer manipulation of the original image. Creative includes completely abstract, altered reality images, All elements must be photographer's original work. This does not allow the use of generative artificial intelligence (AI) components or any stock or public domain imagery as an image component.

Animals – Images of living untamed or domesticated animals. The animals must be the main focus in the image, but may include a wider environment

People – A photograph of a person or persons that may range from a head study to full body length. This section includes candid photographs and formal portraits. The photo may include more than 1 person. The person/persons must be the main focus, but the image can show the surrounding environment.

Landscape/Scenery – A pictorial representation of land, sea or city environments that capture the appeal of outdoor settings.

It can focus on wide angle shots of landforms, rivers, estuaries, sea. seashores. city skylines, or street scenes.

If people, animals are in the images they should not be the main focus. This includes buildings in non-city scapes

Students – All students' images can be of any subjects.
